Competency Based Scale: A score of 3.0 in a competency based system is more in line with a traditional "A" as it is expected level of performance on each complex learning target. A score of 4.0 represents performance that goes above and beyond what is expected of all learners and is not offered for all learning expectations. High performance is defined by a combination of 4.0 scores on some learning expectations and 3.0 scores on learning expectations beyond what is required for graduation.
